Zoho Books vs QuickBooks: The pricing

Zoho Books offers pricing plans that can be purchased as annually or monthly subscriptions while QuickBooks offers plans that can be purchased as monthly subscription. Zoho Books comes with a free plan and five paid plans in comparison to QuickBooks that offers four paid plans. The free plan of Zoho Books is suited for businesses with revenue less than \$50,000 and supports two users, while QuickBooks's pricing starts at \$25/month and supports one user—there is currently no free version of QuickBooks.

The free plan of Zoho Books includes features like invoicing, estimates, bank reconciliation, a client portal, item management, reporting, and more. The paid plans of Zoho Books start from \$20/month and are priced comparatively cheaper considering the value you get in comparison to QuickBooks. The paid plans of Zoho Books come with advanced features like recurring expenses and bills, sales and purchase approvals, a vendor portal, custom roles, multicurrency handling, a custom domain, advanced inventory control, analytics, and more.

Zoho Books offers a flexible trial period of 14 days that requires no credit card to sign up, while QuickBooks offers a 30-day free trial that will make you ineligible for discounts on pricing if you use it.

Please note that Zoho Books offers value over seeming discounts. The pricing plans are tailored in such a way that businesses of varying capacity can find Zoho Books as a budget-friendly option - even without any discounts.



Zoho Books vs QuickBooks: Accounts receivable




Zoho Books and QuickBooks Online offer advanced features in terms of accounts receivable but QuickBooks misses the mark by offering fewer features.

While both Zoho Books and QuickBooks support invoice templates that are fully customizable, Zoho Books offers up to 18 templates whereas QuickBooks offers only six. Similarly, QuickBooks offers estimates as a workaround to track customer orders, but a lack of a sales order feature makes order tracking harder in comparison to Zoho Books.



Sales and purchase approval



Another edge Zoho Books has over QuickBooks is the transaction approval feature. With the transaction verification and approval feature, Zoho Books allows users to verify and approve transactions before sharing them with your contacts. Eliminate the risk of processing and sending incorrect transactions to your customers. Transaction approval allows employees to create transactions and submit them for approval, while a user with specific approval access can verify and edit the transactions if required before approving them.



Payroll

QuickBooks comes integrated with QuickBooks Payroll and offers payroll management features at an additional cost apart from your subscription. While Zoho Books may not have a built-in payroll service, seamless third-party integration (with the likes of SurePayroll) allows users to manage employee payroll easily.

Customer and vendor management



Zoho Books takes the cake when it comes to customer and vendor management thanks to client and vendor portals. With an obvious edge over QuickBooks, Zoho Books's customer management features simplifies collaboration with your business contacts by offering them one place to access and manage their transactions with you.



The client portal allows your customers to view their transactions with you, accept estimates and timesheets, pay invoices, and leave reviews. With the vendor portal, your vendors can upload their invoices, view payments made by you, and view transaction statements with you, all without unnecessary email chains and phone calls.


Automation


